## Babylon UKs Seeking NY Rights Office

North Lindenhurst—The Babylon Town Board voted yesterday to astruct Supervisor Joseph A. Stabile to ask that the State Division of Iuman Rights open an office in Suffolk to handle housing discrimina-

on complaints.

The 3-1 vote, with Stabile absent on vacation in Europe, came a ay after the Suffolk Board of Supervisors voted unanimously Monday o make a similar request to the state. County Executive Dennison has aid that he will veto the county board measure, but the supervisors are spected to override the veto at their meeting July 29. Dennison feels hat instead, town boards should adopt individual open-housing ordiances. Only Brookhaven and Islip have done that.

Saal Lasser, executive director of the State Division of Human ants, said Monday his department hopes to set up a Suffolk office.

The board action was taken after a short recess that had followed to regular meeting. The resolution was introduced by Conservative ouncilman Frank A. Schaeffer who said, "The supervisor is in accord ith this." However, Democratic Councilwoman Sondra Bachety, who sted against the measure, said, "If Mr. Stabile told Mr. Schaeffer aything, they were deliberately keeping the agreement from me."

Mrs. Bachety favors the adoption of an open-housing ordinance

and said that it had been her nderstanding "that the board ould draft a proposal together." chaeffer said that he felt that the cost to the taxpayer of local own offices would be too damn such to bear." He said later that e estimated it could cost beween \$10,000 and \$50,000 to diminister a local housing ordinance and added, "I doubt my local ordinance would be as rong as present state laws."

Mrs. Bachety also said that ne had delayed pressing for acon on a town open-housing orinance because Town Attorney Valter Steindler had written tate Attorney General Louis J. efkowitz Monday asking him to arify a January opinion that sch laws, with penalties including jail terms and fines, are legal, teindler had written the State pepartment of Audit and Conol in June and the department plied that towns were overaching their powers in provid-
